Judge Abernethy Rules for the State

With a comment that the Plaintiffs have been milking this case for too long, Judge Abernethy ruled for the state on both outstanding issues:

1. The state only owes interest on your overtime payment from the final judgment in 2003 until when you were paid the correct amount of overtime in 2006/7. The state does not owe interest on that amount of interest.
2. Plaintiffs who terminated their employment after receiving the final overtime payment are not entitled to penalty pay.

We believe that the Judge certainly erred on the first ruling, and that there are solid legal arguments why the second ruling is also incorrect. Two things will be occurring. First, we will try to finalize the process for payment of what you are owed. Second, we will have to perfect an appeal of these latest rulings. We will keep you updated on both tasks.
